Event Updates

Wallburg and Kamas, among possible other stops. The car show will be on Saturday, August 5th.



Wendover Air Show

Historic Wendover Airfield, August 26th

The Historic Wendover Airfield will be hosting their air show once again! They have not had a proper air show since 2017. Their 2019 show was cancelled due to off-chance weather (right before cancelling shows became a thing), which was devastating on both sides of the fence. This organization is exemplary when it comes to accomplishing restoration projects, having completed restoration work on the Enola Gay hangar, the Barracks Control Tower, Service Club, and much more. The airfield has a very rich history, which the organization is taking great care to preserve. Their ongoing restoration projects include the Dining Hall, Nurse's Quarters, and a C-54 Skymaster. The air show will allow visitors access to many of these restored buildings, and the museum also allows a more intimate look at the history with guided tours at least twice every summer. The Utah Wing will be participating in the air show with presence of static display aircraft.

Spanish Fork Festival of Speed Spanish Fork Airport, September 23rd

Since 2016 the Spanish Fork airport has hosted its Festival of Speed (formerly "Planes, Trains, and Automobiles), and will continue with its seventh annual show this September. The show features not just an air show, but also a car show with racing on the taxiway.
