This Month in World War History



- July 28, 1914 Austria-Hungary declares war on Serbia, effectively beginning WWI.
- July 10, 1940 German Luftwaffe attacks British shipping, beginning the Battle of Britain.
- July 4, 1941 German soldiers mass-murder Polish professors near Lwów, Poland.
- July 3, 1942 Guadalcanal falls to the Japanese.
- July 18, 1942 Germany test flies the Messerschmitt 262, the first fully jet-powered aircraft flight.
- July 10, 1943 US and British forces land 150,000 troops on Sicily in three days. Patton's forces capture Palermo on July 22.
- July 21, 1944 US Marines land on Guam. The last Japanese soldier on Guam did not surrender until January 24, 1972, and returned to Japan.
- July 26, 1944 German Me 262 damages a British Mosquito, the first combat victory by a jet powered aircraft.
- July 16, 1945 First test of a nuclear weapon "Trinity." Truman hints at the Potsdam Conference the US has nuclear weapons July 24.
- July 30, 1945 USS Indianapolis sunk by a Japanese submarine. Possibly the most horrific outcome for sailors abandoning ship.
